A reminder the school has a filtered Water Bottle Filler. Students are encouraged to bring a refillable water bottle, with their name on it to school, to stay hydrated.

CLOTHING AND LOST AND FOUND

Please **label** your child's clothing with their name so we can return it to your child. We have a Lost and Found container at the front of the school but it gets quite full when the items do not get claimed by the owner. Several times a year we need to donate unclaimed clothing as we are unable to store it.

VEHICLES AND STUDENT SAFETY

A reminder to drivers to slow down and watch for students as they make their way to and from their homes before and after school. Please do not park in the bus loop or block the bus loop exit. Also, be considerate of our neighbours and do not block access to their driveways. A reminder that the lower parking lot is for staff only.

STUDENT ABSENCES AND LATES

Thank you.

OFFICE PHONE



Just a reminder for parents and students that the phone in the office is to be used by students for emergencies or sickness only. During and after school, students are not allowed to use the phone to make after school play time arrangements with their friends.

NO DOGS ON SCHOOL GROUNDS



Parents are reminded that School District Policy prohibits dogs from being on school grounds at any time. (Even well-behaved, leashed & muzzled dogs!) This policy is in place for health and safety reasons. Some children are allergic to dogs – others are dog phobic. And even the best-behaved dog can panic when surrounded by dozens of enthusiastic children. We appreciate

those parents who are walking "Rover" to and from school but are respecting our policy by waiting off school grounds for your children. Your cooperation and citizenship are greatly appreciated – thank you!

Ecole Mission Central IS NUT AND SCENT AWARE!

Nut Allergy

Ecole Mission Central now has students who have a serious allergy to nuts, known as Anaphylaxis. Anaphylaxis is a serious allergic reaction that can be **life threatening**. Food is the most common cause of anaphylaxis, but insect stings, medicine, latex, or exercise can also cause a reaction. It has been estimated that more than 600,000 or 1% to 2% of Canadians are at risk of anaphylaxis (from food and insect allergy). Ecole Mission Central is a "**Nut Aware Zone**". Please help us keep our school safe for all students by following these simple rules:

- 1. do not send or bring any nut or nut products into the school
- 2. if you or your child eats peanut butter before coming to school please make sure hands and face are washed and teeth are brushed.
- 3. do not share any food at school.

Additionally, many people are extremely sensitive and/or allergic to perfumes, colognes, after shaves, and other scented products. Please do not wear them in our workplace.
