ÉCOLE MISSION CENTRAL IS PEANUT AWARE!



École Mission Central has students who have a serious allergy to peanuts, known as Anaphylaxis. Anaphylaxis is a serious allergic reaction that can be **life-threatening**. Food is the most common cause of anaphylaxis, but insect stings, medicine, latex, or exercise can also cause a reaction. It has been estimated that more than 600,000 or 1% to 2% of Canadians are at risk of anaphylaxis (from food and insect allergy). A few years ago, a student in our school district had a very serious reaction requiring both the use of his Epi-pen

and paramedic help. He was just walking down the school hallway past a student who was eating a peanut butter sandwich. None of us wants to see any of our students in this serious, life-threatening situation. As such, École Mission Central is a **"Peanut Aware Zone"**. Please help us keep our school safe for all students by following these simple rules:

- 1. do not send or bring any peanuts or peanut products into the school
- 2. if you or your child eats peanut butter before coming to school please make sure hands and face are washed and teeth are brushed.
- 3. do not share any food at school.

ÉCOLE MISSION CENTRAL IS SCENT AWARE!



École Mission Central has several students and staff who have serious allergies to scents. For most people, perfumed, scented or fragrant products are enjoyed, but for those who have asthma, allergies or environmental sensitivities, exposure can result in illness, absence from work and even hospitalisation. The chemicals vaporize into the air and are easily inhaled by those around us. Today's scented products are made up of a complex

mixture of chemicals, which can contribute to indoor air quality problems and cause health problems. Please be aware that scents coming into the school can affect some of our students and staff.

HEALTH AND SAFETY INFORMATION FOR PARENTS AND STUDENTS OF ECOLE MISSION CENTRAL

Student Injury/Illness

The British Columbia School Act assigns teachers the same responsibility as that of judicious parents. Appropriate First Aid will be administered for minor bumps, cuts, and bruises. If there is any question as to the seriousness of the injury or illness, we will err on the side of caution and make contact with the guardian or designated emergency contact. It is the parents' responsibility to ensure that contact information is up-to-date in the office each year. In obvious emergency situations, for example, head or back injuries, breathing problems, broken bones, or other serious injuries, we will not hesitate to call 911 and then attempt to contact you or your designate.

Guests/Visitors to the School

All guests, visitors and parent volunteers are required to report to the office and sign in. Please recognize that this is imperative in ensuring that all students of École Mission Central are safe. This is particularly important at lunch, as our Noon Hour Supervisors are unfamiliar with many parents.

Students on School Grounds

Students are <u>not</u> permitted to leave the school grounds unless they are going home for lunch and have signed permission to do so. Parents are responsible for completing the consent form

Dispensing Medicines

Medicines are not to be sent to the classroom or kept in student's knapsacks at school. For those students who need to take medicine during the school day, we will require a signed form by you for any dispensing of medicine as well as the prescription bottle indicating the drug and the dosage. This includes over-the-counter drugs as well. Please stop by the office and fill in the required information sheet so that your child's care can be maintained.

Emergency Preparedness

Emergency plans for internal and external crises are in place at École Mission Central Elementary and are regularly reviewed with the staff.

Practice fire, earthquake, and lock down drills are conducted several times throughout the year. Students are taught to how to duck and cover, count in anticipation of aftershocks and evacuate the building in an efficient and orderly manner, gathering in a designated place a safe distance from the building. Students are prepared for lock down procedures first through practice and discussion in the classroom and then through an actual drill.

In the event of any emergency, all students are expected to remain at school until contact is established.
