OFFICE PHONE



Just a reminder for parents and students that the student phone in the office is to be used by students for emergencies or sickness only. During and after school, students are not allowed to use the phone to make after school play time arrangements with their friends.

VEHICLES AND STUDENT SAFETY



A reminder to drivers to slow down and watch for students as they make their way to and from their homes before and after school. Consider maintaining a lower speed even after leaving the school zones. Please do not park in the bus loop or block the exit. A reminder that the lower parking lot is for staff only.

NO DOGS ON SCHOOL GROUNDS

Parents are reminded that School District Policy prohibits dogs from being on school grounds at any time. (Even well-behaved, leashed & muzzled dogs!) This policy is in place for health and safety reasons. Some children are allergic to dogs – others are dogphobic...even the best-behaved dog can panic when surrounded by dozens of enthusiastic children. We appreciate those parents who are walking "Rover" to

and from school but are respecting our policy by waiting off school grounds for your children. Your cooperation and citizenship is greatly appreciated – thank you!

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED



Parents, there are many ways you can volunteer at school, including Breakfast Club, reading to students, assisting teachers with Literacy and Numeracy centers, preparation of materials, driving and supervising on field trips, helping out in our PAC concession, to name just a few. If you want to help to make a difference at our school, check with your child's teacher, or contact a PAC executive member to find out about the variety of ways in which you can help. If you are also planning on transporting any students, other than your own, to sporting events, please complete the Volunteer Driver Form. Please check at the office and complete the

district parent volunteer form/driver form and criminal record check. The criminal record check is free. (Parent volunteers are not required to complete criminal records checks every year. If in doubt, check at the office to see if your name is already on our data base.)

Ecole Mission Central IS PEANUT AND SCENT AWARE!

Ecole Mission Central now has students and staff who have a serious allergy to peanuts and fragrances, known as Anaphylaxis. Anaphylaxis is a serious allergic reaction that can be **life threatening**. Food is the most common cause of anaphylaxis, but insect stings, medicine, latex, or exercise can also cause a reaction. It has been estimated that more than 600,000 or 1% to 2% of Canadians are at risk of anaphylaxis (from food and insect allergy). A few years ago, a student in our school district had a very serious reaction requiring both the use of his epi-pen and para-medic help. He was just walking down the school hallway past a student who was eating a peanut butter sandwich. None of us want to see any of our students in this serious, life-threatening situation. As such, we are making Ecole Mission Central a "**Nut and Fragrance Free Zone**" starting in September 2011. Please help us keep our school safe for all students by following these simple rules:

- 1. do not send or bring any peanuts or peanut products into the school
- 2. if you or your child eats peanut butter before coming to school please make sure hands and face are washed and teeth are brushed.
- 3. do not share any food at school. Additionally,
- 4. individuals do not wear perfumes, fragrances, scents into the school. This can include: body spray, scented deodorant/antiperspirant, scented body lotion.

HEALTH AND SAFETY INFORMATION FOR PARENTS AND STUDENTS OF ECOLE MISSION CENTRAL

Student Injury/Illness

The British Columbia School Act assigns teachers the same responsibility as that of judicious parents. Appropriate First Aid will be administered for minor bumps, cuts, and bruises. If there is any question as to the seriousness of the injury or illness, we will err on the side of caution and make contact with the guardian or designated emergency contact. It is the parents' responsibility to ensure that contact information is up-to-date in the office each year. In obvious emergency situations, for example, head or back injuries, breathing problems, broken bones, or other serious injuries, we will not hesitate to call 911 and then attempt to contact you or your designate.

Guests/Visitors to the School

All guests, visitors and parent volunteers are required to report to the office and sign in. Please recognize that this is imperative in ensuring that all students of Ecole Mission Central are safe. This is particularly important at lunch, as our Noon Hour Supervisors are unfamiliar with many parents.

Students on School Grounds

Students are <u>not</u> permitted to leave the school grounds unless they are going home for lunch and have signed permission to do so. Parents are responsible for completing the consent form

Dispensing Medicines

Medicines are not to be sent to the classroom or kept in student's knapsacks at school. For those students who need to take medicine during the school day, we will require a signed form by you for any dispensing of medicine as well as the prescription bottle indicating the drug and the dosage. This includes over-the-counter drugs as well. Please stop by the office and fill in the required information sheet so that your child's care can be maintained.

Emergency Preparedness

Emergency plans for internal and external crises are in place at Ecole Mission Central Elementary and are regularly reviewed with the staff.

Practice fire, earthquake, and lock down drills are conducted several times throughout the year. Students are taught to how to duck and cover, count in anticipation of aftershocks and evacuate the building in an efficient and orderly manner, gathering in a designated place a safe distance from the building. Students are prepared for lock down procedures first through practice and discussion in the classroom and then through an actual drill.

In the event of any emergency, all students are expected to remain at school until contact is established with a parent or designate.
